The Duo was awarded a special prize from the **Accademia Pianistica Siciliana** "For the best performance of works by foreign composer" and the award of the **Radio of Russia** "For loyalty to the traditions of piano-duet music-making".

- The duet won the **first prize** of Konzerteum International Piano Competition in Greece in piano ensemble category

The duo's repertoire includes masterpieces of romanticism and classicism, compositions of the XXth century, as well as works by modern composers. The Concerto for Two Pianos and Orchestra and "The Book of Marches and Dances in Memory of Valery Gavrilin" were composed by Igor Rogalev specially for the PetRo Duo.

It was PetRo Duo who premiered, among other works, Capriccio for two pianos of "Le bal masqué" by F. Poulenc, I. Rogalev's Fantasy on the themes of the "Polovtsian Dances" by A. Borodin, "Lullaby" by Tchaikovsky, "Procession of princes" from the Opera "Mlada" by N. Rimsky-Korsakov, "Shéhérazade" and "Pavane pour uneinfante défunte" by Maurice Ravel, "The Street is in Turmoil" by Alexander Davidenko (edited by A. Rogalyova), three fragments from the ballet "The Limpid Stream" by D. Shostakovich.

In 2017, the piano PetRo Duet Anastasia Rogaleva & Dmitrii Petrov was played following the world premiere:

- · "Duet" four hands of an unknown composer from the album Avdotya Ivanova (recorded in album 1 Jan 1786)

- · A. Preuss. Large military March dedicated to the Empress Maria Feodorovna
- · I. Vorobyov "Don river Capriccio" (for two pianos)
- \cdot I. Rogalev, "Twelve characteristic pieces on a single theme" , "Dollhouse" (for 2 pianos)

PetRo Duo is a regular participant of festivals "From Avant-Garde to the Present Day," "The Baltic Piano Duos", "St. Petersburg Musical Spring", "On the Way to Vyborg".

The duo has toured in Japan, France, Italy, Greece, Finland, Estonia, and Russia.
